



There are a number of Exeter Organisations dedicated to helping people with drug and alcohol related problems and assisting their families.

ENDAS (Exeter and North Devon Addiction Service)

This is a joint agency service (Health Service and Social Services), offering help to people with drug or alcohol related problems. It aims to help change, prevent drug and alcohol misuse and criminal activity. The services it offers includes an arrest referral scheme; a drug treatment testing order; a community drug and alcohol team; specialist care workers; a substitute prescribing service; and a prolific offender unit.

Referrals are made through your G.P., the Probation Service, or EDP. They are based at Wonford House Hospital, Dryden Lane, Exeter, EX2 5AF - tel: 01392 208 210

They provide a range of services depending on the needs of the person:

- Full needs assessment
- Specialist worker
- Safe space to talk over options
- Group work
- Late night opening on Wednesdays
- Access to user and carer groups
- Advice and support
- Community and inpatient detoxification
- Substitute prescribing
- Relapse prevention
- Access to employment, leisure, education, housing and other services
- Referral to partner agencies, for example EDP
- Hepatitis B and C advice, screening and immunization
- Community care assessment for rehabilitation services.

Addaction – Devon Alcohol Intervention Service

This service offers confidential and free counselling support and advice to individuals, principally for alcohol problems, but also for a combination of alcohol and drug problems. Services include advice and information, assessment, referral for detoxification, one-to-one counselling, onward referral to other agencies and referral to specialist health services. EDP Drug and Alcohol Services

This service comprises over 100 staff and volunteers who work with adults, young people aged 11-18, and people in prison, who have problems with drugs and alcohol. They also offer support to the families and professional carers of these people.

They offer one-to-one structured key working; referral to other services; street homeless outreach workers; through care and aftercare for people in the criminal justice system; structured day programmes; women only times on Tuesday mornings; and a safer injecting service including needle exchange.
